About the Workshop

In this workshop you will learn how to draw the figure through an understanding of light and shadow on a live model. Francis Bowyer will help you understand the basic principles of tone and chiaroscuro to produce a series of sketches from a clothed and nude model.

This course is open to all levels.

Morning

- Initial introductions and a group discussion on expected outcomes from the session.
- Working from a series of short poses performed by a life model you will produce a series of quick sketches. Francis will offer one to one advice and direction throughout.

Afternoon

- Break for lunch
- Working from a series of longer poses performed by a clothed model you will produce more considered sketches. Francis will offer one to one advice and direction throughout.
- Review/crit: there will be a chance to view each other's work and an opportunity to ask questions.

About the Tutor

Francis was born in London and studied at St. Martins School of Art and Chelsea School of Art. He has exhibited widely across the country, and has work held in the Royal Collection and HRH Prince Charles Collection. Francis' paintings of Walberswick, Suffolk; interiors of Parisian restaurants; and more recently studio interiors, create a lively vibrancy that has enchanted the public at each exhibition.

Materials

- A few sheets of watercolour paper
- 10 sheets of A1 drawing cartridge paper
- Any water-based medium to suit e.g. ink, watercolour or gouache
- Charcoal
- Drawing pencil(s)
- Eraser(s)
- Pastels
- An A1 drawing board to work from
